Best moments in Year 6

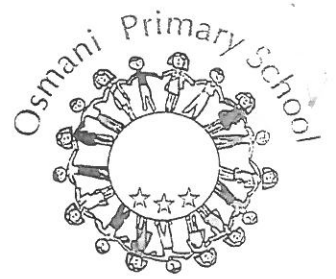
I can't believe it's over! Year 6, which has been a fun-filled year, was both exciting and stressful.

One trip I will never forget is the residential trip to Kingswood. One of the

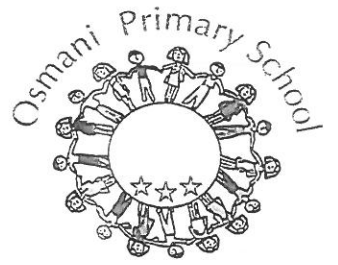
