This week we are going to be thinking about how we can use our hands to help others. What do you use your hands for?

PE- exercise is very important so we encourage you to engage in some form of physical activity. This could be a video on youtube or a walk in your local area.

Maths

Our maths focus this week will be sequencing our day.

Key vocabulary - morning, afternoon, night time, breakfast, bedtime, story time

Monday - Listen to and sing number songs together. Practise writing numbers 1 - 10

Tuesday - Talk about your daily routines. What you do in the morning, in the daytime and at night. Work through this presentation with your child. Encourage them to speak in full sentences when responding to the questions.





Wednesday - Today have a look at the morning and night time activities. If you can, print out the pictures and have a go at the activity. If not you can simply discuss with your child when they do each activity - When Day and Night

Thursday - As part of our Spanish lessons we have been learning how to talk about different times of the day. Join us by listening to this song -

Friday - create your own routines timetable. We have included some images that you can print off and use. Place this in your child's bedroom or somewhere they can easily refer to it.

Extra activities

- 1. Continue practising number formation.
- 2. Play Simon Says and ask your child to go under, in, between objects.

3. Ask your child lots of questions so that they can begin to think about the times they would like to do something.
