Make a poster about Easter. Include facts, pictures and ways to celebrate.	Make an Easter Bunny or Easter Egg out of different materials. What materials did you use and why?	Write a non-chronological report about Easter.
Bake an Easter themed cake. Write out your recipe and take a photo of your masterpiece.	Write an Easter themed poem. It could be acrostic or a haiku or any other type of poem that you find interesting.	Write the Easter story in your own words. Try to modernise it as if it were happening today, not over 2000 years ago.
Create a crossword word search themed around Easter.	Write a diary entry for each day of your holiday. You can write about what you do each day, where you go OR where you want to go. Add photos that you take along the way.	Make a quiz for children to answer. Make sure the questions are about Easter.
Design your Easter Egg Hunt for your siblings OR for your parents. Draw an aerial view map of your hiding spots.	Research the Easter Bunny. Find out about where it came from and why it is so popular during Easter time?	Research the history of Easter. Find out about why it is so important to Christians and where it originated from?
