










Nursery - Spring 2, 2024

<p>Personal, Social, Emotional Development</p> 	<p>We will be supporting the children to continue to develop their social skills such as sharing, being good friends, being kind and gentle with each other. We will do this through our school rights and the use of TAG. The children's independence and resilience as learners will be encouraged through learning about what it means to have a growth mindset. We will continue our work with the "All About Me" box which allows each child to share details about themselves as an individual in a supportive environment. Through this we aim to develop the children's confidence to talk about themselves as unique individuals.</p>
<p>Communication & Language</p> 	<p>We will continue to encourage the children to speak in full sentences and listen to each other and the adults in Nursery. There will also be daily opportunities for sentence building and storytelling activities to promote oral language. We will collect and learn new and interesting words to develop our vocabulary. We will be listening to sounds, songs, rhymes and stories and joining in with them.</p>
<p>Physical Development</p> 	<p>We will be working on our running skills in the playground and focusing on our catching and throwing skills. The children will continue exploring the environment and developing their confidence in climbing, riding bikes and building with blocks and poles. The children will be supported to develop independence with all their toileting, dressing and feeding needs while at school. We will encourage the children to be confident to independently express their needs to staff. We will be developing the children's fine motor skills and control through mark making, weaving, cutting, threading and sorting activities. We will be practising pencil grip and control through handwriting patterns, pencil control exercises and mark making opportunities around the nursery environment..</p>
<p>Literacy</p> 	<p>Our topic this term is People Who Help Us, so we will be looking at different stories that include a range of people that help us in our daily lives. We will also provide a range of materials throughout the nursery setting for the children to develop their mark making skills. We continue to work on name writing with all of the children. We will also be learning about the different parts of books and authors that we like to stimulate the children's interests in books and reading. We will continue to deliver daily phonic sessions and work on the set 1 sounds of Read Write Inc.</p>

<p>Mathematics</p> 	<p>We will be working on reciting numbers to 30 focusing on 1:1 correspondence and consolidating our number and shape recognition skills. To develop this number learning further we will also be working on recognising numerals in preparation for number formation and introducing the children to finding one more. We will also be recapping 2D shapes and trying to find them in the environment.. We will also introduce mathematical language in relation to height. We will develop this through hands-on, practical activities.</p>
<p>Understanding the World</p> 	<p>We will be learning about growth and change this term. As part of this topic we will learn about healthy eating and lifestyles. We will also watch as the weather and seasons change. We will also be learning about our local environment and community, including our homes and our local shops e.g. Whitechapel Market. We will continue to celebrate the children as individuals by continuing with our “All About Me” box activity and helping them to talk confidently and positively about themselves. We will continue to introduce the children to the range of technology and technological toys in the nursery, particularly through role play activities and helping them to develop their skills and understanding of how to use and care for it. We will also be introducing children to the Easter story and talking about how this is similar or different to what they celebrate.</p>
<p>Expressive Arts & Design</p> 	<p>We will be encouraging children to express themselves in a variety of ways, including dancing, painting, modelling, drawing, singing and playing musical instruments. We will offer the children the opportunity to be creative in a range of art activities and learn how to create different effects with different media. The children will be encouraged to engage in imaginative role play in various areas of the nursery with a range of props.</p>
