Title: Rivers of Time: Ancient Egypt and the River Nile

This homework has been set from the week beginning 12th February 2024. The homework project is due on Wednesday 28th February. For this project homework, can you please select one or more activities below and complete them. You will present what you have found out to the rest of your class. Please ask for whatever paper you need from your teacher during the homework project. This homework project is for the whole family to get involved with and we would encourage children to get help completing any of the activities.

Create a Nile delta model using a foil tray, tin foil, clay river and topsoil. Add pyramids and trees. Plant seeds in the topsoil and see what happens when water is poured into the river each day to "flood" the Nile delta.



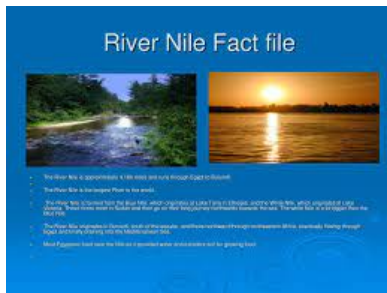
Make a model of a pyramid and create text for labels giving information about it.



Use Egyptian number hieroglyphs to solve and create number sentences.

Create a fact sheet all about the River Nile



Use a toilet roll, scissors, string or rolled paper, PVA glue and golden paint to make an Egyptian bangle.



Estimate how long a piece of toilet paper from a roll would need to be to mummify the child's finger/hand/foot/arm/leg/whole body and check.

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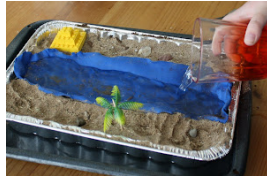


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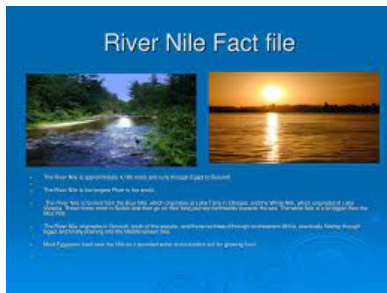
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
