Spring 2 – Viking Invaders 2023-2024

Dear Parents and Carers.

Our topic this term is: Viking Invaders



In this topic children will learn more about the cycles of invasion and settlement of the British Isles. They will start to think about the pattern of invasion and settlement in the British Isles, looking back over their learning about previous Roman and Anglos Saxon invasions. They will find out about the Viking invasion that followed the Anglos Saxon invasion, and how this changed people's lives and culture. They will research aspects of Viking life, including transport, religion and stories, clothing and weapons, using a range of sources, producing reports and presentations using their research findings.
