Maths

Learning Intention: To talk about weight.

Explain to children that this week we will be learning about weight and ordering objects from lightest to heaviest.

1. Introduce key vocabulary (heavy/ light). Get children to collect 6 items of interest from around the house. Chn to weigh two items at a time and predict which one they think is heavy/ light.
2. Watch this Youtube video looking at objects that are heavy and light.

How to help young children learn at home.

You can help your child to learn through the little things you do with them, for example:

- everyday conversations
- make-believe play
- games with numbers or letters
- reading together
- involving them in the things you are doing, such as household chores, and talking with them about it

You do not need to set separate time or plan complicated activities dedicated to learning. These activities can be built into everyday life and play.

You know your child best. Avoid forcing them into lengthy planned activities if they naturally respond better to a mix of shorter activities. This can stop them getting bored or frustrated and keep them active, interested and learning through things they enjoy.
