#### **Maths**

Learning Intention: To find one more.

Explain to children that we will be learning about finding 1 more. Explain what 1 more means.

- 1. Sing the number song '1 little speckled frog' Before adding each frog model using fingers to find out what one more would be. Ask: how many will there be if one more came into the pool?

  Continue adding one more speckled frog each time until you get to 5
- 2. using the leaves you collected on your walk, give your child some leaves to count and ask them to find one more get your child to show you the answer using their fingers.
- 3. Play games with your child asking them to find 1 more of a number of items/objects. For instance, count how many soft toys they have tell them to add 1 more, ask if they now have more or less, and how they know.

Learning Intentions- To write simple sentences about Autumn.

This week we will be learning all about Autumn.

After this take your child on a walk and look out for the signs of Autumn and talk about them. Whilst on your walk collect some autumn items such as leaves, acorns and twigs.

- 1. Write a sentence together containing a fact about Autumn. Use sentence starter "In Autumn"... Remember to use a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop.
- 2. Children to use their phonic knowledge to write a simple sentence containing facts about Autumn. Use sentence starter "In Autumn..."

# How to help young children learn at home.

You can help your child to learn through the little things you do with them, for example:

- everyday conversations
- make-believe play
- games with numbers or letters
- reading together
- involving them in the things you are doing, such as household chores, and talking with them about it

Find ideas for new things you can try at <u>Hungry Little Minds</u>.

You do not need to set separate time or plan complicated activities dedicated to learning. These activities can be built into everyday life and play.

You know your child best. Avoid forcing them into lengthy planned activities if they naturally respond better to a mix of shorter activities. This can stop them getting bored or frustrated and keep them active, interested and learning through things they enjoy.
