## **Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2012/13**

Increase the rates of progress and raise attainment of pupils in Maths and English across the school. Increase the rate of progress across the whole school i.e pupils making 2sub levels(4points from their starting point)

## **Measuring the impact of PPG spending**

The school evaluates the impact on each pupil at the end of each term. The evaluation focuses on the progress the pupil has made and the levels they have achieved as a result. We also evaluate how the intervention has impacted on the pupil's confidence.

Evaluations show that additional support has impacted positively on outcomes for pupils.
